SCRIPTURE: Remember Leviticus 19:18

IT IS THOUGHT: This is one of the first social/interpersonal ethics communicated by a religion
Not a Rule, Regulation or Precept

SCRIPTURE: Exodus 20:1-4, 12-15

Then God spoke all these words: I am the LORD your God who brought you out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You must have no other gods before me. Do not make an idol for yourself—no form whatsoever—of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters under the earth...Honor your father and your mother so that your life will be long on the fertile land that the LORD your God is giving you. Do not kill. Do not commit adultery. Do not steal.
